- Teachers are running Professional Development Committees. Specialists are included.
- Auction Update: Families purchased signs. The signs have already been made. Due to budget
 cuts the waiting period to install the signs has been longer than expected. The school has
 submitted work orders for the installation of these signs.
- There are safety concerns at around the school during drop off and dismissal.
 - Officer Sloan observed and evaluated safety issues. Officer Sloan was invited to speak, but was not able to attend tonight's PTA meeting.



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 Talking points were provided to Principal Donnelly to address these safety issues. Some examples: Recommendations were made for installing sidewalks and crosswalks.
 Families/kids should be crossing streets only at the crosswalks.

4th Grade Teachers Spotlight

- Introductions by the 7th grade team.
- This year's focus in Social Studies is Virginia Studies.
- 4th grade classes will raise brook trout and in June there will be a field trip to release them.
- The Regions Fair was held during the 3rd week of school. It was great having additional computers in the classrooms for the kids to use for their research.
- Jamestown field trip is a 4th grade tradition. What the kids will see and learn directly relates to their Virginia Studies. They will visit the ruins, Jamestown settlement, go onto one of the 3 ships, and visit the glass house where they will see how glass was blown.
