Intro and Ex-Comm Summary

- PTA President Nic Cober welcomed meeting attendees.
- PTA Executive Committee members introduced themselves.
- Flyers were distributed that visualized how the last year's PTA funds were disbursed.

 - Noted previous year carryover amount was reserved for the Kiss-and-Ride retaining wall project. Additional funds are being raised via this year's Brick fundraiser.

Audit Committee Summary

- The Audit Committee worked during the summer to review the 2016-2017 PTA financials.
- Alissa English served as the Audit Chair. The committee had 6 volunteers.
- No major discrepancies were found.
- After the audit was completed Alissa met with Nic Cober Johnson, Jennifer Monken and Katie Pisocky to discuss recommendations for improving accounting practices and audit committee procedures.

October Events

Brick Fundraiser update by Nancy Trainor of the Landscaping Committee.

- 120 bricks have been sold. The goal is to sell 400 bricks by October 31st.
- There are 3 main reasons this fundraiser is important to our school.
 - The standing area will be expanded since currently there is not enough room for kids.
 - The wall will be 18 inches tall so kids can sit on it.
 - The hillside is very steep and area is eroding. The wall will prevent kids from running down the hill and address the erosion problem.
- Contributing a brick is a great opportunity for our families to stamp our names on the school and show our support for the school and the community.
- Each class that sells 10 bricks will get a pizza party. Many families have multiple kids. Each child's class will get credit for the sale.

- \$150 for the small brick (4"x8"). \$275 for the medium brick (8"x8"). \$400 for the large brick (12"x12").
- Funds raised will first pay for the Kiss-and-Ride retaining wall. Any funds leftover will be for the PTA.
- Fonts are all capitals and the same size.
- Your full donation is 100% tax deductible.

Principal Remarks - Mr. Donnelly

- Thanked the staff members in attendance tonight.
- Principal's Advisory Committee (PAC) has a classroom teacher from each grade, as well as, specialists and staff. They are reviewing the Haycock Mission and Vision Statements and working on applying the guiding principles throughout the school.
 - Events like STEM Night, camp highroads, family movie night, and bike to school day promote a unified community in our school.
 - Viewed a video that explained developing a growth mindset - the belief that one can learn more or become smarter if one works hard and perseveres. The message in the video aligns with Haycock's Vision Statement. (Information is available on the school's web site at: <https://haycockes.fcps.edu/features/growth-mindset>.)
- Reviewed 3 areas of the School Innovation and Improvement Plan (SIIP) goals for this school year.
 - Raise the bar goal: This year's Math Goal is 65% of students will achieve a pass advance in course assessment. Using Math Workshop strategies will help us reach this goal. Math Workshop divides kids into learning groups to focus on areas like independent work, learning with partners, etc. After the group learning period ends the kids come together as a class to discuss what they learned. Last year ended at a 63% pass advance rate.
 - No gap between racial categories goal: The gap between students passing course assessments is 5% or less (African/Hispanic compared to White/Asian). Last year ended at 7% gap.
 - Individual growth goal: All instructors show a positive increase in at least 2 of 7 components of the CLT cycle.
